



### **HISTORIC OVERVIEW**

of Software Freedom Day Events

Since our inception, the Digital Freedom Foundation has organized over 4000 events worldwide, raising awareness and fostering a global community committed to digital freedom. After the hard stop with COVID, we have succeeded in growing Software Freedom Day to its former glory. Here is the number of events registered on the map of Software Freedom Day:



2020: 24 events | 2021: 39 events | 2022: 33 events | 2023: 49 events | 2024: 63 events

While this growth look promising, we're far away from the 560 events organized yearly in the beginning of the previous decade.

## **BRIEF HISTORY**of the Digital Freedoms Foundation

The Digital Freedom Foundation traces its roots back to January 2004, when Matt Oquist realized that free software had matured enough for public use, yet public ignorance remained a significant barrier to its widespread adoption.

Inspired by the idea of distributing valuable software like Open Office, Firefox, and GIMP to the public, Matt envisioned an international day dedicated to handing out **free software CDs**. This vision resonated with Henrik Omma and Phil Harper from TheOpenCD project, leading to the inception of Software Freedom Day (SFD).

The first edition of SFD was celebrated on August 28, 2004, and aimed to unite everyone without a vested interest in proprietary software to educate the public about the benefits and ideals of software freedom. The initiative quickly gained momentum, with Henrik, Phil, Matt, and other board members forming Software Freedom International, a non-profit corporation in New Hampshire, USA.

Over the years, the DFF has seen contributions from numerous dedicated individuals, including Sidsel Jensen, Joe O.A. Olutuase, Benjamin Mako Hill, Pia Waugh, Pockey Lam and Frederic Muller.

Under Frederic Muller's leadership, the organization expanded its focus to include other events like **Hardware Freedom Day** (HFD) and **Document Freedom Day** (DFD), reflecting the broader scope of digital freedoms.

### **RECENT CHALLENGES**

and New Beginnings

Over the last decade, the Digital Freedom Foundation faced several challenges, including the gradual reduction in active board members, leaving a small core team to maintain the movement. During this period, the board worked diligently to keep the organization operational, ensuring that key initiatives like Software Freedom Day continued

While active promotion and outreach were limited, their dedication preserved the foundation's core mission and provided a platform for future growth.

In 2023, a renewed leadership team brought a fresh wave of energy and passion to the organization. With extensive experience in organizing Software Freedom Day events, the new board has already made significant strides toward revitalizing the foundation.



In their first months, the new board increased the number of Software Freedom Day events from 34 in 2022 to 63 in 2024, nearly doubling participation. This growth was made possible through the generous support of organizations and companies promoting the event through their networks. With this momentum, we are confident we can surpass 100 events by 2025.

Additionally, the team has streamlined the event registration process through a unified website, making it easier than ever for new teams to participate. We are also proud to announce a partnership with the Earth Cause Charity, which enables US-based companies to make tax-deductible donations to the DFF, further supporting our global mission.

These achievements mark a new chapter for the Digital Freedom Foundation, one focused on growth, engagement, and empowering communities to advocate for software freedom worldwide.



### **LOOKING AHEAD**

In 2025, the DFF is focused on deepening engagement with existing Software Freedom Day teams while encouraging early registrations. To support this, we will be offering promotional packages to teams that register ahead of schedule, ensuring that they have the resources needed to make their events impactful.

We are also excited to explore the relaunch of Document Freedom Day in collaboration with **The Document Foundation**, expanding our efforts to promote the importance of open standards and document interoperability.

Beyond these events, the DFF is committed to raising awareness about the growing threats posed by proprietary software and opaque cloud services. By empowering local teams and providing them with the resources they need, we envision a future where communities worldwide can advocate for digital freedom and implement open-source software solutions that benefit everyone.

# PRIMARY FUNDING GOAL Financial Support Promotion Packs

Description: Local teams love it when their event can show some nice visuals or hand out interesting swag. Donations earmarked to create promotional packages (e.g. for SFD) will be used to enable sending out packages to teams who register in time. Sample promotion packs can contain:

- · 1 banner flag (2'5" x 6' or 75 cm x 175 cm)
- · 2 quality T-shirts
- · 50 stickers
- · 10 pencils
- · 10 balloons
- · 2 USB sticks

#### Goal

- · Create Promotional packages for predefined number of teams.
- · Encourage teams to register early.

### Benefits for sponsor

- · Brand awareness placement of brand on DFF supporters page as long as the support is offered
- · Perks-wise: tier accordingly to yearly donation amount.

#### **Estimated** cost

- · Ordering perks for 100 teams (=target), would cost around \$10.000 (US). This includes custom print and shipping to all locations.
- This cost can come from 1 or multiple sponsors.

### Media and Promotion

**Description:** During two phases, we need to make noise about Software Freedom Day:

During the preparation phase (4 months prior), we need to remind people to start preparing for their Digital Freedom Events. The target audience here is the community of people who care about FOSS and are part of active groups. These can be dedicated groups like hackerspaces, GNU/Linux User Groups, or enthusiastic individuals in schools, companies, or organizations.

#### Goal: activate teams

During the launch phase (weeks prior to the event), we need to make noise to the wider communities in the areas where teams organize events. Here we need to advertise broadly and strongly rely on the local embedding of the teams.

**Goal:** Advertise broadly to reach new people

#### **Estimated cost**

· Cost of publication

### **Prizes and Competitions**

**Description:** Challenge teams to achieve specific goals to win a prize.

#### Goal

- · Encourage teams to register early
- · Encourage teams & members to actively participate in the community
- · Create a community feeling

### **Benefits for sponsor**

- · Perks-wise: aligned with 75% of sales price of the product
- · Promotion of an interesting product (page of challenge)

### Estimated cost: Cost of device

### Requirements

- The prize must be aligned with the values of the event.
- · Applications and devices need to be run natively on GNU/Linux operating systems.
- · Stand-alone devices must run open systems and adhere to open standards.

### Tools & infrastructure DFF

**Description:** Offer free usage of infrastructure or tooling to keep our organization operational.

**Goal:** Facilitate organization of the DFF based events

### **Benefits for sponsor**

· Perks: aligned with 75% of the price of the service on yearly basis

Estimated cost: Cost of service

### Requirements:

- The tool must be aligned with the values of the event. Cloud services need to be based on a Free Software License (according to the FSF).
- · Stand-alone devices must run open systems and adhere to open standards.



### **Financial Support operations DFF**

**Description:** Donations earmarked to pay for operational costs of DFF (paid services, expenses, ...)

#### Goal


· Facilitate organization of the DFF based events and operational logistics

### **Benefits for sponsor**

- · Recurring sponsors get awarded the perks for the amount donated x 125%

#### **Estimated** cost

- Yearly costs for GPL'ed software with updates and support: \$250
- Yearly cost for domain name registration: \$35 x 5 domains = \$175
